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### Musculoskeletal Examination Of The Shoulder

Doing the basic aspects of a musculoskeletal examination is especially important in the shoulder: The key to performing a good shoulder examination is to develop a system in which the patient is prepped so you can (1) see the shoulders; (2) compare both sides; (3) do a neurovascular examination; and (4) consider the joint above, which in this case is the cervical spine.

### Musculoskeletal Examination of the Shoulder: Making the ...

The Apley scratch test assesses combined shoulder range of motion by having the patient attempt to touch the opposite scapula: Reaching overhead, behind the neck, and to the opposite scapula with the tips of the fingers tests abduction and external rotation; reaching under, behind the back, and across to the opposite scapula with the back of the hand tests adduction and internal rotation.

The Shoulder - Examination Techniques. Shoulder pain is one of the most common musculoskeletal complaints. It may be due to problems intrinsic to the shoulder (85% of the time) or due to referred pain (most commonly from the neck). Causes vary by age of the patient. Inspection: Inspection of the shoulder should occur without obstructing clothing.

### Mastering Your MSK Exam

With the elbow flexed at 90° and tucked into the patient's side, assess external rotation of the shoulder. Loss of external rotation may indicate adhesive capsulitis ('frozen shoulder') or other glenohumeral joint problems. Ask the patient to raise their arms behind them and to the front. Assess flexion and extension.

### Examination of the shoulder | Versus Arthritis

The physical examination includes observing the way the patient moves and carries the shoulder. The patient should be properly disrobed to permit complete inspection of both shoulders.
