### The up and down impact of the pandemic on health care costs

Many bring home less today than they did a decade ago — and one reason is the high cost of health care benefits. According to a Kaiser survey of employer-sponsored health benefits , employees' share of insurance premiums increased by 81 percent between 2004 and 2014, and health insurance deductibles have grown six times faster than workers' earnings since 2010.
